# TAKE ACTION Zonta Advocacy Action Center



The Zonta International Advocacy Action Center is a tool for members in the United States to take action to improve the lives of women and girls. With your help, we can make a difference.

One way is in support of the Equal Rights Amendment.

The ERA was passed by Congress in 1972; however, it has never been fully ratified. Its ratification would provide a constitutional guarantee that all men and women are truly equal under the law and that these rights cannot be easily abridged. **Without the ERA, women do not have equal rights under the law.** 

Your help is needed to urge legislators to remove the deadline for ratification of the ERA. Two joint resolutions have been introduced to that end, but more co-sponsors are required.
