

<u>Laura Chavez, 2020 Amelia Earhart Fellow</u> from Purdue, gave our AE program meeting on January 26 via Microsoft Teams. The youngest of five children, Laura is the first to leave her home in Bogota, Columbia, where she attained her bachelor's degree in geology. This degree in Columbia is five years rather than four, however in her 5th year, she came to Purdue for a six-month internship and she has also spent some time at the NASA Johnson Space Center. Now in her 3rd year at Purdue, she expects it will take six years to finish her Ph. D in Planetary Sciences.

Her work involves studying "very, very, small particles" (*much smaller than a grain of salt*!) that come from asteroids, handling these with glass needles in a sterile lab and using special microscopes. These studies determine how asteroid surfaces evolve, which is important because asteroids rich in organic compounds can be life sustaining.
