SERVICE COMMITTEE NEWS

During our February membership event, we hope to use a portion of that time to pack activity kits for Ascent 121. We kicked off our activity kit journey at our program meeting in November. We asked that members collect an item for each day of our 16 days of activism. We have had a good response; however, we will need more supplies if we hope to hit our goal of 24 manicure kits and 12 pedicure kits. We still need the following items in the quantities listed:

If you do not want to go on the hunt for items, we can also accept cash donations to purchase what is still needed as we approach our February date. Ascent 121 is committed to helping survivors of commercial sexual exploitation with a mission to "empower young people and their families through long-term recovery services to position them for their next chapter in life".

For our book drive project, we have collected 212 books to date! This project is to collect children's books to stock the Free Little Library locations on the square and at the Boys & Girls Club. It is proven that there is a strong link between reading and success, making it an essential activity for personal development. The US ranks 125th for literacy rate among all countries (*IMSE Journal*). According to Forbes magazine, low literacy levels among US adults could be costing the economy \$2.2 trillion (*yes, that is with a 'T'*!) per year. We will continue to collect books as an ongoing project. Books can be new or gently used children young adult books. We can also take adult books, but prefer those for the younger kids.

YWCA Update:

As shared previously, the YWCA of Greater Lafayette opened a Sexual Assault Case Advocate office early this Fall in the Healthy Communities of Clinton County building. Initially staffed with one case advocate, the office now has two full-time advocates, Ashley Miers and Bree Palmer. They are available 24/7 - 365 from crisis intervention through trial. The YWCA also offers a support group in Clinton County.

This support group - Healing Forward Sexual Assault Support Group - focuses on healing and coping skills. They use the books Life After Trauma and Healing From Sexual Trauma Workbook. There is a mix of open table group discussion and lessons from the books, choosing one topic each week to focus on while also allotting time for group members to openly share about what is going on in their lives. Topics include but are not limited to: reclaiming safety, self-worth, focus, control, creating boundaries, cultivating self-compassion, confidence, and resilience. The Sexual Assault Support Group meets at Healthy Communities of Clinton County, 1234 Rossville Ave. Suite A, from 6-7:30pm on Fridays with a Zoom option available.

It is important to note that the sexual assault could have happened at any time (*last week to a decade ago*) and the YWCA knows healing is a process and is here to support. If you know someone who might benefit from these services, please share this information.

Zonta International celebrated 103 years on November 8th. As part of the Every Member Every November Campaign, members and others around the globe donated just over \$156,000 to the Zonta Foundation for Women. These dollars help support all Zontians' commitment to fund our International Service Projects and Educational Programs for the current biennium. Six months into this biennium, these and prior donations total just over \$760,000 of the \$5,473,000 needed.
