This public event brought members, along with family and friends, to the Frankfort Library on January 11th to hear Leslie Goddard as she portrayed Amelia Earhart. Leslie allowed us to "meet" Amelia and hear of her experiences as the first woman to cross the Atlantic by airplane (1928), the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic (1932), and the first person to fly solo from Hawaii to California (1935). We also heard how she learned to fly, what inspired her adventurous spirit, and why she set off in 1937 for an around-the-world flight.

Amelia Earhart was an active member of the Zonta Club of Boston and New York during 1928-1937. Zonta International named January 11 as Amelia Earhart in honor of her as a famous Zontian and in recognition of her accomplishment to be the first person to fly solo to the United States mainland from Hawaii which she began on this date in 1935.

On Amelia Earhart Day, and throughout January, we celebrate her spirit and impact as one of Zonta's most famous former members and her contributions to the aerospace industry and her empowerment of women in science.
