Martina, studying at the University of Illinois-Chicago, is one of three AE Fellows working on their PhDs in District 6. She is flanked by Sandy Venn-Brown, ZI Director and Liaison to District 6, and our own Susie Trees, Chairman of the D6 Awards/Scholarship Committee.

On September 27, Darrell Sanders, Director of the Clinton County EMA (*Emergency Management Agency*) shared information about his work and the steps the Agency takes before, during, and after an emergency event in our community.

Depending on the type of disaster or emergency, there are more than 40 entities or organizations that may require coordination by EMA. In addition to specific Frankfort City and County offices (Sewage Dept., Street Dept., Water Works or the Board of Health, Commissioners, Extension Office, Highway Dept.,), others include: 911 Dispatch Center, American Red Cross, Churches, Fire Depts., Hospital, Kaspar Media, Law Enforcement, Nursing Homes, Power Companies, Salvation Army, School Corporations, and Service Organizations.

The Clinton County EMA mission is to reduce loss of life and property while protecting our county's critical infrastructure from all types of hazards. They do this through a comprehensive, risk-based, emergency management program with the goal of helping citizens prepare for and cope with any type of emergency.


