

# AMELIA EARHART PROGRAM

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 10, 2024

Members, as well as family and friends, came for a relaxing evening at the Frankfort Library's Skanta Theatre to watch "<u>AMELIA</u>", starring Hillary Swank and Richard Ghere in



Amelia Earhart was an active member of the Zonta Club of Boston and New York during 1928-1937. Every January we celebrate her as one of Zonta's most famous members and her contributions to the aerospace industry and empowerment of women in science.

Eighty-nine (89) years ago, Amelia Earhart's legacy was strengthened, as she became the first woman to fly across both the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. In May of 1932, she flew solo from Newfoundland, Canada to Londonderry, Northern Ireland and, on January 11, 1935, she flew solo from Honolulu to Burbank, California. She also became a faculty member with Purdue in 1935 as a counselor on women's studies.


Her position with Purdue proved very beneficial a couple of years later in her plans to fly around the world as, through donations of cash and equipment totaling \$80,000, Purdue established "The Amelia Earhart Fund for Aeronautical Research" which help fund her "flying laboratory", the new Lockheed Electra airplane that was specially outfitted for long-distance flights.

While there have been numerous theories about Amelia Earhart's disappearance, as well as explorations in attempts to solve it, the mystery continues. Yes, we shall never know exactly what happened. Of this only we are certain: Amelia died as she lived, doing the work she loved with her whole soul. Amelia left a letter to her husband George Putnam saying, "<u>Please know that I am quite aware of the hazards. I want to do it</u> <u>because I want to do it. Women must try to do things as men have tried. When they fail, their failures must be a challenge to others."</u>

In 1938, Zonta International established the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Program, enabling women to study at an advanced level, pursuing Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace engineering and space sciences. The \$10,000 Fellowships are offered annually to 30 women and since 1938 there have been 1,734 AE Fellowships, totaling more than \$11.6 million, awarded to 1,305 fellows from 77 countries. Funded by donations to the Zonta Foundation for Women, AE Fellow alumnae have gone on to become astronauts, aerospace engineers, professors, planetary scientists, business owners, CEOs, university chancellors, Secretary of the Air Force, director of Carnegie Observatories, and director of the Lunar and Planetary Institute.

During "Intermission" members and guests enjoyed refreshments of popcorn and "movie box" candy. And, \$110 was donated to support our various service activities and projects!

The DVD of "<u>Amelia</u>" was loaned to the WeCare Recovery Home, along with microwave popcorn and "movie box" candy, for their own "movie night", since these ladies were unable to attend ours!

# YOUNG WOMEN IN PUBLIC AFFAIRS AWARD

The Service Committee has sent the YWPA information and application to all local school districts and also posted the opportunity on Facebook. Applications are due back to the Frankfort Club no later than March 8.

Once the local award recipient is selected, her application will be sent on to the district level for consideration. The local recipient is awarded \$1000. The district award winner application is sent on to Zonta International where the possibility exists for an additional \$5000.

Applications for the Career Advancement Scholarship offered by our Zonta Club will be sent out in the next few weeks. This is a \$1000 scholarship and the eligibility criteria is as follows:

- A Clinton County Resident •
- 19 years old or more at the time of the application
- Can document financial need. •
- Shows ability to complete education or upgrade vocational skills. •
- Has been admitted to, or cleared for admission to an academic or vocational school which is licensed • or accredited by the State of Indiana.
- Furnishes a plan of schooling with specific vocational objectives that fit the situation, including class • tuition fees and qualifications of the applicant to take the course of study.
- Members of Zonta and their immediate families are ineligible.

WOMEN IN BUSINESS of any age, pursuing Jane M. Klausman SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is offered to a women a business program with major field of

specialization in accounting, economics, finance, business management, business technology, information technology, marketing, operations management, human resources management, international business, or entrepreneurship at an accredited university/college/institute (including online students), who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field and are living or studying in a Zonta district/region.

The program operates at the Zonta club, district/ region and international levels. Zonta International offers 37 international scholarships of US\$5,000. Each district/region may submit one applicant for consideration for an international scholarship with the five largest districts being allowed to submit a second applicant for a total of two.

# Message on Ukraine from Zonta International President

Since Russia attacked Ukraine in February 2022, hospitals, critical infrastructure, schools, and residential areas have been bombed, innocent civilians have been killed, and children have been deported, causing the worst humanitarian crisis in Europe in decades. The Ukrainian people that were forced to flee and those that remained behind have endured two terrible years of war, violence and instability. Women especially struggle to keep their families together, ensure the health and safety of their children and deal with the long -term emotional and physical damage inflicted by the prolonged violence and instability.

While we cannot imagine the horrors they have witnessed throughout these last two years, we have been reminded again and again of the strength and resilience of the Ukrainian people and of our own Zonta clubs in Ukraine, who have stepped up to respond to the immediate needs of women and children fleeing the violence. We are deeply impressed by their actions and by the support provided to them from around the Zonta world.

While we demand a rapid end to this war, as Zontians, we will continue to build and support a global community of individuals who share a common commitment to equality and peace for all people.

Warm greetings from Germany! I just returned home from my site visit to our Ending Child Marriage project in Nepal.

Nepal is one of the 12 countries where our partners **UNICEF USA** and **UNFPA** are working with the support of Zonta International on a Global Programme to end this violation of human rights. Together with other Zontians, I traveled under the lead of Mansi Mehta from UNICEF USA to the rural area of Lumbini. There, we met with adolescents, parents, teachers, social workers and stakeholders in the communities.

In Nepal, UNICEF and UNFPA partnered with government entities to develop the Rupantaran program, which means "transformation" in English. It is a social and financial skills training package aimed at empowering girls and strengthening their resilience. Through the program, adolescents receive training on various topics, including sexual and reproductive health, earning and saving money, identifying safe and unsafe places, and good and bad touch. The program encourages girls to speak up and express their desires, as well as define their visions and goals for life while emphasizing the importance of education and labor skills. This comprehensive empowerment program for adolescents is needed everywhere - not only in Nepal.

We also had the opportunity to attend classes and interact with adolescents and the community. It was a joy to see how powerfully these girls spoke up against child marriage and described their life goals. Some spoke about becoming teachers, policewomen, doctors, nurses or entrepreneurs. All participants of the program were impressed by these efforts that were taken to end child marriage thanks to your generous donations to the Zonta Foundation for Women.
